# **Hispanic Mother-Daughter Program**

Since 1984, the vision and mission of the **Hispanic Mother-Daughter Program (HMDP)** at ASU has been to increase the number of students who complete a bachelor's degree by directly involving parents in the educational process.

## **Apply**

Eligible parent-student teams apply during their seventh-grade year. The applications process is a two-step process with an application phase and an interview phase. Following the application deadline, parent-student teams will be notified if they are invited to continue on to the interview phase.

## **Eligibility Criteria**

Applicants must meet the following criteria to apply:

- Neither parent/guardian has received a bachelor's degree
- Be currently enrolled in the 7th grade
- Be at 7th grade English and math level
- Have a 2.75 GPA or above in core classes (English/language arts, math, science or social studies)
- Have aspirations of attending ASU

## **Program Information**

Cost: Free to all participating parent-student teams

#### **Program Commitment:**

- 5-year program commitment beginning in 8th grade and through high school graduation
- Participants are advised at their school 2 to 4 times per academic year
- Participants and parent/guardian attend 4, 2-hour evening workshops per academic year on weeknights at the ASU Tempe campus

#### **Program Benefits:**

- Develop a personal commitment towards higher education
- Receive academic guidance from ASU staff 8th grade through 12th grade
- Direct access to ASU resources and early outreach opportunities
- Enhance the parent-student relationship
- ASU application fee waiver
- Graduates of HMDP are eligible to apply for the Early Outreach Scholarship offered through Access ASU
