

## AMERICAN DREAM ACADEMY

The American Dream Academy is an eight-week program that helps parents gain the tools, knowledge and skills necessary to help their children achieve their highest academic potential. Parents who participate in the program learn how to be effective advocates and partners in their children's education. ADA culminates in a graduation ceremony for the parent and/or student.



# Arizona community team wins first place in Alliance for the American Dream competition

Project Benjamin, a cross-sector coalition of organizations from Arizona, was **awarded \$1 million** from Schmidt Futures as part of the Alliance for the American Dream competition for its plan to use a chatbot to scale a strategy to boost Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) completions in 67 area high schools.

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## HISPANIC MOTHER-DAUGHTER PROGRAM

Since it was founded in 1984, the Hispanic Mother-Daughter Program has positively impacted parents and students by providing college readiness curriculum and advising nearly 500 student-parent teams on an annual basis. Participants begin the program in the students' eighth grade year and continue throughout their high school years.

In 2019, the Hispanic Mother-Daughter Program celebrated its 35th anniversary. HMDP has helped generations of students and families in metro Phoenix achieve their higher education goals.

# ASU recognized for efforts to support Latino student success

ASU is committed to serving its communities and those individuals who wish to pursue a college degree, regardless of their background or socioeconomic status, and to provide the support resources required for all students to succeed. For those efforts, ASU was one of nine institutions to earn the 2019 Seal of Excelencia, a prestigious, voluntary and comprehensive certification granted by the Washington, D.C.-based organization Excelencia in Education.

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# PREPARING FUTURE SUN DEVILS

Future Sun Devil Family Day engages middle and high school students and families in college preparation workshops presented four times per year at each of ASU's four metro Phoenix campuses.

# AMERICAN INDIAN FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

Access ASU continues to focus on building a college-going pipeline of students from underserved communities. Through conferences, seminars and summer enrichment programs, Access ASU engages with American Indian youth and families to improve student outcomes and success in partnership with ASU's Office of American Indian Initiatives.



#### RECHARGE conference

The annual Arizona State University RECHARGE conference provides an opportunity for American Indian students in grades 7-12 to invest in their education, future and community. The event features engaging activities and inspiring presentations, including topics on culture and identity, college readiness, financial aid and scholarships, college majors and ASU campus resources.

# Urban Indian Education Work Group

## SUMMER PROGRAMS



#### César E. Chávez Leadership Institute

The César E. Chávez Leadership Institute is a high-impact leadership program for Arizona high school rising juniors and seniors. Through a series of engagement opportunities students have the chance to live on campus, explore higher education, develop leadership skills and discover the value of civic engagement.

#### Camp Catanese

Camp Catanese is a weeklong STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and math) and college preparation summer camp experience serving Phoenix area students. The program helps underserved youth close the achievement gap through educational opportunities.

#### \$7 million GEAR UP grant will help ASU and community partners offer college prep to students and families

Thanks to a \$7 million grant recently awarded to Arizona State University by the U.S. Department of Education, Arizona students and their families will have greater access to a college education and a foundation for a bright future. ASU is one of 55 educational institutions to receive a U.S. Department of Education Partnership GEAR UP award from the 2018 GEAR UP competition. The award is a seven-year grant, providing \$1 million in funding annually over the life of the grant.

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#### SPARKS

SPARKS is a student-led service organization at Arizona State University promoting access to higher education throughout the community. Beyond serving as role models to Arizona youth, SPARKS members have access to unique networking and professional development resources.



#### DREAMZONE

DREAMzone was developed as a comprehensive professional development training at ASU that provides student leaders, staff and faculty with the knowledge, skills and resources necessary to effectively respond to the needs of undocumented students. DREAMZone's primary objective is to create inclusive and supportive environments.

#### Program highlights

- The 2018-2019 school year included 24 workshops that certified allies who are now knowledgeable about DREAMzone services and scholarship resources. At the same time the program raises awareness of systemic barriers, while enhancing cultural and professional sensitivity.
- The DREAMzone support circle, a collaboration with ASU Counseling Services consistently provided a safe space, mental health support and networking opportunities.


