


- Today's statewide case count is 863, with 525 cases (61%) in Maricopa County.
- The demonstrated epi curve continues to increase in Maricopa County and statewide. Case counts are consistent with late May at the time that exponential growth began following the statewide stay-at-home order being ended.
- Percent positivity statewide is 7.0%. Maricopa county positivity is 7.0%. More testing is needed to characterize the extent of the current outbreak and community transmission.
- Statewide, ED visits and inpatient bed use for COVID-19 continue to increase, including ICU beds and regular ward beds. There is no indication yet that hospital resources are at risk of becoming overwhelmed.


























### Hospital Usage





