


- Today's reported statewide case count is 138 with -30 cases in Maricopa County. This is due to back-correction of data, including additions and removals of cases from September to the present. Removal of cases is usually a correction for double reporting or incident date. The majority of cases added are from the past 2 weeks, while removals date back to October. Daily positivity is not included in the table today, due to the data corrections.
- The 7-day average for reported cases continues to trend downward and is 519 today.
- 7-day average positivity continues to trend downward and has now dropped below 10% for ten days.
- Hospital utilization continues to decline slowly and remains at rates similar to mid-October for ICU and non-ICU beds, and mid-November for ER visits for COVID-19.
- Bed usage for COVID-19 is 7% of inpatient beds and 10% of ICU beds statewide. Current hospital utilization is 88% for inpatient beds and 85% for ICU beds including COVID and non-COVID utilization.
- Hospital mortality continues to slowly increase, reflecting the high acuity of patients hospitalized with COVID-19 despite improved clinical treatment options. Overall case mortality remains stable. COVID-19 remains the leading cause of death in Arizona in a 12-month period.




















Hospital Usage
