

WHAT IS THE ASU HISPANIC MOTHER DAUGHTER PROGRAM?

The Hispanic Mother Daughter Program (HMDP) is a five-year outreach program designed to raise the education and career aspirations of **first generation students**. HMDP is designed for both the student and their parent/guardian. Parents/Guardians are actively involved throughout the program and attend workshops with their student. Students who are selected into the program will gain leadership skills, academic support, preparation for college, and a stronger relationship with their parent/guardian.

Beginning in 8th grade through 12th grade, the program includes two components:

- Advising participants 2 times per academic year.
- Participants and parent/guardian attend four, 2-hour evening workshops per academic year.
 Workshops occur on weeknights at the ASU Tempe location.

Both components are requirements if selected for the program. <u>Participant and parent/guardian must commit to attend all programming from 8th grade through 12th grade.</u>

Topics covered include: (subject to change)

- Commitment to higher education
- Four-year high school academic planning
- Leadership skill building
- Community and civic engagement
- Financial literacy
- Social preparedness
- College admission process
- Financial aid
- Scholarship
- Personal statement writing
- Introduction to college majors

Additionally, participants learn about the benefits and advantages of attending ASU. Including the many resources available through Access ASU, ASU summer programs, and opportunities to network with ASU staff, faculty, and community leaders.

If you and your student would like to enhance your academic achievement and personal growth through a support network of school counselors, community leaders, and university professionals, apply to the ASU Hispanic Mother-Daughter Program.

Applications are due Friday, February 21, 2020.



Dear Parent and Student:

You are invited to apply to the Hispanic Mother-Daughter Program (HMDP) at Arizona State University (ASU) for the upcoming 2020-2021 academic year! HMDP is an early outreach educational program that has been educating, preparing, and empowering participants to achieve academic excellence for university admission and graduation for over 30 years.

The program is designed to increase the number of **first-generation** Arizona students who are qualified and prepared to enter higher education through direct family involvement. If selected to join, **HMDP requires a five-year commitment to the program**. Selected parent/student teams are agreeing to attend workshops and events at ASU's Tempe campus beginning the student's 8th grade year through to the completion of 12th grade.

The benefits of the program include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Enhance parent/student relationship
- Reach personal goals and achieve academic excellence
- Connect to the ASU campus

Eligible applicants **must** meet all of the following selection criteria to apply:

- Neither parent has received a bachelor's degree or above
- Be currently enrolled in the 7th grade at a participating school district
- Have a minimum 2.75 GPA in their core classes (English, Math, Science and Social Studies)
- Have aspirations of attending college or a university

The enclosed application packet includes the following:

- Instructions to submit a complete application packet (parents should read and keep this document)
- Application/Essay to be completed by student and parent or legal guardian
- One recommendation form to be filled out by either a current Science teacher, Math teacher or English teacher.

The application, essay, letter of recommendation, and a copy of the most recent grade report must be received **no later than Friday, February 21, 2020.** Late and incomplete applications will not be considered.
