Consider pursuing a graduate degree

A graduate degree will help you take advantage of the highest paying opportunities, as well as the roles with the most leadership and responsibility.

Know the application process

Start early! It can take one year or more to secure a job within government sectors and involves a rigorous interview process. Having your fingerprint clearance card upfront can help when applying for jobs.

Uphold the law

Having a misdemeanor or felony on your record can disqualify you from many government positions.
