Getting Ready for Orientation

Step One: Register for Orientation

By now you should have paid your ASU Enrollment Deposit, and reserved your spot at New Student Orientation.

Step Two: Prepare for Orientation

Make sure you are ready to register for classes on your orientation day by completing the following important steps:



Housing: Confirm your housing application before attending orientation.



Immunization Records: ASU requires students to submit documentation of Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) immunization 72 hours prior to orientation.



Submit Photo

Submit your photo online. You will need to click the tab that best defines you.



Select ID

- Plan ahead select the type of student ID you want at Orientation.
- Select between the Sun Card or the Pitchfork ID MasterCard® Check Card, which includes free Sun Devil checking from MidFirst Bank.
- Pick up your Photo ID at the end of orientation.



Math Placement Exams: ASU requires all incoming freshmen to take an <u>online math placement exam</u> at least 72 hours prior to orientation. You will not be able to register for courses without a math placement score.



SAT/ACT Scores: Submit your SAT and/or ACT scores prior to orientation. These scores are used to advise and place you in appropriate courses.



Final Transcripts: Final transcripts are not required in order to register or attend orientation. Submit an <u>official high school transcript</u> once finalized. Request an official transcript be sent from your high school to <u>ASU Admission Services</u> as early as possible.



My ASU: Familiarize yourself with your My ASU account. Don't forget your username and password, you will be using it throughout your time at ASU, and it is important to check it regularly for required tasks and communications from ASU before and after your Orientation session.



Bring your laptop with you. You will need this to register for classes and your advisor will help you bookmark useful pages.
