- Enroll in a Service Learning (USL) class at ASU.
- Begin completing education for required language skills (2 semesters college level coursework in Spanish and/or French).

- Participate in Peace Corps Week Activities in March.
- Learn more about Peace Corps all while earning credit by enrolling in the Peace Corps Seminar (BIS 355).
- Participate in hands-on community service in the Dominican Republic during the “Taste of Peace Corps” Spring Break Study Abroad.
- Earn a Peace Corps Prep Certificate by completing 100 hours of community service and enrolling in intercultural competence courses. Log on to eoss.asu.edu/peacecorps for more details.
- Complete your Peace Corps application 9-12 months before you want to leave for service. Make sure to meet with your Campus Based Recruiter to review your resume and strengthen your application.

- Log on or set up an account with Sun Devil CareerLink (eoss.asu.edu/cs/sdcl) to request an advising appointment to have your resume reviewed, schedule a mock interview or simply discuss your career path with a professional advisor.
